

Dear praying friends,

Thank you for your care and love. We praise the Lord for so many brothers and sisters who genuinely show the love of Christ.

Since our country is moving toward world isolation (together with Russia), I couldn't sit and wait for a complete shutdown. We have to get Timothy to good doctors. Last Friday, we drove to Poland, and our friends here helped us immensely. We are able to rent a comfortable two-bedroom apartment (nothing fancy), and today is our 6th quarantine (out of 7) day. We have several challenges. Our visas expire after March 31st and Timothy and I still don't have the visas for the UK for a doctor's appointment. It turned out that our friend here knows a Polish counsel to Belarus. That man took a personal interest in our situation. He contacted the UK ambassador in Belarus and asked to help in our case. We are waiting for his reply.

Parallel to that, we are in contact with our friends from Switzerland, trying to find good doctors there who could look at Timothy. We always have to work on several choices because it is difficult to get anywhere due to our citizenship. I would probably prefer Switzerland because we could drive there and I don't have to leave Ola and the girls here in Poland. Anywhere we go, it will be really expensive, but the main goal is to find the best available doctors to look at Timothy's eyes and tell us if there is anything that can be done. It seems like every step we take the Lord is already there. We just have to take those steps now.

Together with friends and churches (along with our church and our family), we are sending help to help to Ukraine. I personally know the believers we are helping for many years. All of them are faithful Christians. One is a good brother Dima from Kyiv. He decided not to evacuate. He has three kids, and his wife is due at any moment. They are witnessing to lots of people daily while trying to provide food and basic necessities. Please pray for them.

Another location is Zhytomyr. My friend Vladimir pastors an independent Baptist church there. I preached at his church, and he preached at ours. They are being bombed from Belarus. This fact breaks my heart even more.

We also helped a church in Khmelnytskyi, where I attended a Bible Institute for four years. Many people are stopping there for a night and receive food and the Gospel. They are doing wonderful work too.

After our quarantine is passed, and if we have to stay in Warsaw for some time, I would like to actively help refugees here as well. Close to 1.5 million Ukrainians fled to Poland. I could transport them from the border, feed them, and find places to stay here. I want to keep the apartment we are renting for a longer time. When we are not here, I am sure there would be people who would need it at that time. It will be around \$1000 a month.

If you would like to help with any of these needs, please get in touch with me. I can send you those friends' personal info and let you know how you can help even without me being involved.

We have no clue what the future holds. Our goal is to get back to Belarus where God has called us to. But right now, I make no plans beyond getting my son to doctors. Please pray for guidance and wisdom.
