We were informed yesterday that we could pick Cheryle up at 4:00 PM to take her home. It actually took the nurses until about 5:00 to disconnect her from all the monitoring equipment, IV, and oxygen, and help her get dressed. She enjoyed eating her first meal with us in a week, and getting caught up on the news. Last night she slept more comfortably without all the wires and tubes being connected to her body, as she was able to turn over and move. She woke up this morning feeling much better. She actually did a few minutes work in the kitchen. That tired her out, and she had to go back to bed. But she says she is feeling much better.

She still has fluid in her lungs, for which she is taking medicine. She is supposed to have a heart checkup in two weeks. Please pray that no permanent damage has been done to her heart.

She is still a long ways from being back to normal, but we are pleased with the progress.

God has heard and answered your prayers. Thank you so much for your love, concern, and prayers.

Dear friends in Christ,

Please pray for my wife, Cheryle. Her blood pressure shot up to 197 over 127. Then she start having trouble breathing. An x-ray revealed that her heart was swollen. So, we thought this was all related to heart problems, so we made a appointment for her to see a cardiologist this coming Monday. However, this past Thursday (April 2) she started having such bad pain in her chest that we took her to the emergency room at Integris Hospital here in Oklahoma City. She thought she was having a heart attack. She said it was the most pain she had ever experienced in her life.

They immediately started tests, and said that she had a bad case of pneumonia. Shortly thereafter they said that she also had the flu, but they didn't think it was the coronavirus.

However, they were wrong---her test for coronavirus came back positive.

They are medicating her with plaquenil.



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We have since learned that she also has congestive heart failure, but we do not know to what extent. Nor do we know if that was caused by the coronavirus.

As of this writing, she is very tired and weak. She said that her blood pressure was high again this morning, and that she had a fever of 100 degrees. And she still has some pain in her chest, though nothing compared to what it was Thursday. The plaquenil is making her nauseous. Her doctor says that she is doing better. And that is all we know at this point.

She is not allowed any visitors. We can only communicate by phone.

Our son, Isaiah, and I probably have a mild case of the coronavirus too. We are trying to avoid contact with others, so that we don't spread it around.
